

THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM

The 1992 platform of the Republican Party states, "We believe the unborn child has a fundamental individual right to life which cannot be infringed. We therefore reaffirm our support for a human life amendment to the Constitution . . . We oppose using public funds for abortion and will not fund organizations which advocate it . . . We reaffirm our support for the appointment of judges who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life."

THE DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM

The 1992 platform of the Democratic Party uses "choice" as a code word for abortion and states: "Democrats stand behind the right of every woman to choose, consistent with *Roe v. Wade*, regardless of ability to pay, and support a national law to protect that right." The platform also claims that the right to abortion is a "fundamental constitutional liberty."

Absentee ballots

According to Michigan law, you are eligible to vote by absentee ballot if one of the following applies:

- You are 60 years of age or older
- You will be out of town on election day
- You prefer to vote absentee because of illness, physical disability or religious tenets
- You are confined to jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- You are an election precinct inspector in a precinct other than the one where you preside

To get an absentee ballot simply call or write to your city, township or village clerk and ask for an absentee voter application. Or, apply in person to the clerk and fill out a standard form. If you want the ballot mailed to you, your application must be received by 2:00 p.m. on the Saturday before an election date. Your vote must reach your local clerk before the polls close on election day at 8:00 p.m.

The Big "R"

In the movies it means Restricted because the show isn't fit for children. For people dedicated to the prolife agenda, the big "R" should stand for **Respect**.

The old, the handicapped, the sick in their infirmities and pain, try our patience much of the time. The responsibility to care for one of these may fall to some of us personally, and the manner in which we carry it off will cull **Respect** in them, in ourselves and in those around us. We must devote ever more of our efforts to oppose the enthusiasm for euthanasia that rocks the moorings of our country, and we must be quick to challenge the spurious semantics that accompany it.

The children—struggling for growth and maturity in the wilderness of their own little world—are crying out for **Respect**. They need always—at whatever age and no matter how aggravating—to be treated as "real people."

Candidate Questionnaire Responses

The following five-question survey was sent to each candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives and the Michigan State Legislature:

1. In the near future, the U.S. Supreme Court may vote to overturn its 1973 decision legalizing abortion on demand. In that event, would you SUPPORT legislation permitting states to restore protection to unborn children, except to prevent the death of the mother?
2. Rape, incest, and fetal deformity have all been offered as reasons for legislation to deprive innocent unborn children of their civil rights. Would you OPPOSE these exceptions?
3. Would you SUPPORT all legislative efforts to continue to prohibit tax-funding of abortion except where necessary to prevent the death of the mother?
4. Would you SUPPORT legislation that would ban fetal experimentation and the use of tissue from aborted babies for transplant treatment of diseases?
5. Would you OPPOSE legislation if it contained provisions which would cause a person's death who was not imminently dying?

NOTE: Lifespan is not a political organization and does not endorse candidates for election. We have surveyed the candidates as a service to our members. The responses we received are printed without bias, although some had to be edited because of space limitations. The Questionnaires are on file at the Main Office for your perusal. If you need further verification on a candidate's stand on these or other issues, please contact the candidate directly.
