THREE MORE MONTHS OF MEDICAID ABORTIONS VOTE "YES" FOR LIFE

Lifespan does not normally publish a newsletter during the summer. This special August edition is being written because the Medicaid abortion referendum requires untiring vigilance, even during the hot, lazy months.

Readers will find inserted another copy of the flier we're using to promote a full-page ad (hopefully) in the <u>Detroit News</u> on November 6th. The names are coming in, but we have a long way to go if we are to get 4,000 names and the needed \$16,000.00. I have some suggestions members can follow in order to reach this goal.

1. Send in your name TODAY, if you haven't done so.

2. Ask your spouse, children, mother, father, aunt, uncle and cousins by the dozens to join you in sponsoring the ad.

3. Ask your neighbors while chatting over the back fence or sharing a barbeque.

4. Take forms to church and ask members of your congregation to support the ad. 5. Ask your church pastor if he will announce our project after services or

print the flier in his church bulletin. Members of Word of Faith Fellowship Church in Dearborn donated \$668; the Church donated matching funds for a total donation of \$1336!

6. Take copies of the flier to your local Christian book store. We know of several that are inserting the flier with every purchase. (Extra copies are available at all our offices.)

A word of caution concerning the existing Channel 7/Free Press poll reported on Page two. OVER-CONFIDENCE CAN BE FATAL FOR THE UNBORN. While this poll is very encouraging, remember that in order to end Medicaid abortions on Tuesday, November 8, we will need to get that 58% to go to the polls and vote "YES." It is much easier to be against funding when you are asked on the phone; much more difficult to get out in the cold and go to the polls. To insure victory, your help is needed right up until ELECTION DAY.

POLL SHOWS VOTERS FAVOR BAN ON MEDICAID ABORTIONS 58% WANT TO RESTRICT ABORTION FUNDING

By a 2-1 margin, Michigan voters want to end Medicaid subsidies for abortions according to a Free Press/WXYZ-TV survey published in the Free Press July 18, 1988. "Fifty-eight percent of likely voters want to restrict the use of Medicaid-paid abortions for women who receive public assistance; 30 percent want to maintain Medicaid-paid abortions and 12 percent were undecided."

"Interviews with voters after they participated in the survey suggest that opposition to taxes may outweigh whatever feelings women may have about the right to choose abortions," according to the article written by Karen Schneider, Free Press staff writer.

"Women are somewhat more likely than men, by a 61 percent to 55 percent margin, to want to end abortion funding."


SENATE FINES WOMEN'S COMMISSION

The State Senate chastised the state's Women's Commission for running an article in its newsletter promoting the pro-abortion People's Campaign for Choice and its referendum effort to repeal P.A. 59. Prolife senators were successful in cutting \$3,500 from the Commission's budget. The \$3,500 was the amount reserved in the Commission's budget for printing the newsletter. The senators noted that it is inappropriate for a state-funded body to promote either side of a ballot proposal. One senator requested an investigation into the entire matter.
