

## Make your vote count

One vote for a prolifer = dozens of letters to a pro-abort legislator

Do you ever get the feeling that you are being ignored? Many of you have written more letters to your representatives since January than you have your entire life. But Congress just doesn't seem to be listening. Why not?

Consider this familiar scenario: Congress is about to pass a bill that is hostile to family values. Pro-family citizens deluge Capitol Hill with letters and tie up the switchboards for days. But when Congress votes, it passes the anti-family measure anyway. Why do lawmakers ignore us? Why don't we command more respect?

It helps to understand the way a politician thinks. Their highest priority is always one thing: getting re-elected. Before every decision a congressman will ask the following question: "What will this do to me on election day? Will it hurt my chances, or help me to be re-elected?"

The people who command a congressman's respect are those who can change the outcome of their re-election campaign. Whoever pays the fiddler calls the tune.

Our opponents understand this much better than we do. On July 3, 1989, the day the Supreme Court returned the abortion debate back to the political arena, Kate Michelman of NARAL stepped up to the microphone, looked into the cameras and sent a message to every politician in America: "Take our rights, lose your jobs." She spoke their language, and they got the message. What else is to account for the dozens of politicians who suddenly had a change of heart and became "pro-choice?" They didn't all discover some new fact of fetal development or constitutional law. They feared for their jobs.

The following five question survey was sent to each candidate for U.S. Congress, Michigan Governor, and the Michigan State Legislature:

- 1. Would you <u>support</u> an amendment to the United States Constitution which would establish protection for all human life including the unborn and prohibit abortion except to save the life of the mother?
- 2. Rape, incest, and fetal deformity have all been offered as reasons for legislation to deprive innocent unborn children of their civil rights. Would you oppose these exceptions?
- 3. Would you <u>support</u> all legislative efforts to continue to prohibit tax-funding of abortion except where necessary to save the life of the mother?
- 4. Would you <u>support</u> legislation that would ban fetal experimentation and the use of tissue from aborted babies for transplant treatment of diseases?
- 5. The question is no longer whether to remove life-support systems, but whether to deny medical treatment and basic care from persons not imminently dying. Would you <u>oppose</u> this legislation unless it contained provisions preventing the denial of treatment and basic care for the purpose of causing a person's death who was not imminently dying?

# Legislative Update

#### National



Freedom of Choice Act (HR 3700, S1912)

This bill would prohibit any restrictions on abortion prior to fetal viability (around 23 weeks). After viability, the bill would grant women an abortion for "health" reasons (the Supreme Court has ruled that "health" includes any factor pertinent to a woman's "well being"). Thus , in practical terms, the bill would bar states from placing restrictions on abortion at any point during pregnancy.

Write or call your Congressional representatives in Washington urging them to OP-POSE this bill.

#### Michigan



Parental Consent Bill

Over 300,000 signatures have been submitted to the State Elections Bureau to initiate legislation which would require that minors seeking abortions obtain the consent of at least one parent for the procedure. After the signatures are validated, the Michigan legislature has 40 days to vote on it. If passed by a simple majority vote, the measure automatically becomes law. If rejected, it will be voted on by the general public in November of 1991.

Urge your Michigan legislators to support this citizen-initiated legislation, which would restore to parents and teenagers the rights and protections they deserve.

## Patient Advocate Bill HB 4016

In the wake of the Supreme Court's Nancy Cruzan decision, it is even more important that we understand the distinction between withholding medical treatment to allow natural death, and withholding the basic necessities of life (food and water) so as to cause death.

We support the concept of allowing individuals to appoint a surrogate decision-maker, which is what HB4016 would allow. However, we remain concerned for patients who are not imminently dying, or are not even terminally ill, but are at risk of having their basic necessities such as food and water withheld.

#### Registering to vote

In Michigan you may register to vote if

- You are a United States' citizen
- You are at least 18 years old by election day
- You have lived in Michigan for at least 30 days before the election in which you are voting

To register, simply appear in person at any Secretary of State Branch Office, or at your city, township or village clerk's office. Fill out a form swearing you are who you are, sign your name, and that's it! Under special circumstances you may register by mail.

You may register at any time. However, you must be registered 30 days in advance of an election in order to vote in that election. If you have moved, notify the local clerk. If you move within Michigan during the 60 days before an election, you may vote at your former precinct in that election. You may only be registered in one precinct at a time.

#### Absentee ballots

According to Michigan law, you are eligible to vote by absentee ballot if one of the following applies:

- You are 60 years of age or older
- You will be out of town on election day
- You prefer to vote absentee because of illness, physical disability or religious tenets
- You are confined to jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- You are an election precinct inspector in a precinct other than the one where you preside

To get an absentee ballot simply call or write to your city, township or village clerk and ask for an absentee voter application. Or apply in person to the clerk and fill out a standard form. If you want the ballot mailed to you, your application must be received by 2:00 pm on the Saturday before an election date. Your vote must reach your local clerk before the polls close on election day (8:00 pm).

Quite honestly, many politicians think the pro-family movement is all bark and no bite. They know we can raise a ruckus in April, but they just don't believe we'll be there in November. They don't fear us at the polls. Have we given them any reason to? An astonishing number of Christians aren't even registered to vote. To a politician, these folks are non-entities. They don't exist. They are "unpersons," to use Orwell's phrase.

But there's another problem. Voting Christians suffer from a case of "terminal niceness." We are far too quick to forgive and forget. Like a man or woman who meekly embraces a spouse despite repeated acts of infidelity, pro-family citizens allow their representatives to betray them time and again without suffering any repercussions. No wonder they don't fear us.

Every good relationship is built on mutual respect. This is true in the home, in the workplace, and in the public square. That respect must be earned and protected. When one partner commits an offense, forgiveness is called for. But the relationship is in jeopardy when the offense is repeated again and again with no real show of repentance. Time has come for "tough love." It's time to let the offender feel the consequences of his or her actions.

Either we're too squeamish to let a few political heads roll, or we have very short memories. A politician may spend years in opposition to our values, then four weeks before an election issue a press release vowing to be more pro-family. So,

we keep them in office. They will then spend the next several years voting against us, confident we'll forget again come election day.

Not only are we hesitant to punish our betrayers, we often fail to reward our friends. I was reminded of this during a recent visit with some pro-family state legislators. They thought it was shrewd of President Bush to invite gay activists to the White House. When I protested, they reminded me that every time they vote against "gay rights," the gays respond by turning out hundreds of volunteers in support of their campaign opponents. The gays remember friend and foe come election day, and they work to put profamily politicians out of office one by one.

These legislators also told me that none of them have ever benefitted from the profamily votes they cast. No volunteers - no one to go door to door, answer phones, distribute flyers or attend precinct caucuses for them.

If the pro-family movement wants to be heard, if we are really serious about getting and keeping legislators in office who will listen to our point of view, we have got to earn their respect. Virtue may be its own reward, but elections are won by votes.

## U.S. Senate: Clark Durant v. Bill Schuette

Rape & incest exceptions, judicial appointee positions vary



#### Clark Durant (R)

Are you pro-abortion, pro-choice or prolife? Prolife.

Would you support abortion in cases of rape or incest? No.

Would you support a Human Life

Amendment? Absolutely.

Would you support efforts to eliminate funds for organizations which promote, perform or refer for abortion? Not only support, but I'd actually work to do it. When I was chairman of the board of Legal Services Corporation, we supported efforts to eliminate funding for groups if they were engaged with Planned Parenthood.

Would you vote to sustain a President's veto of pro-abortion legislation? Of course.

Tell me the qualifications of an appointee for Supreme Court whom you would support. I think they have to be strict constructionist, which means they interpret the law and don't make law. But on the other hand, they should be willing to overturn Roe v. Wade, because it is clear that it was wrongly decided as a matter of law, forget the facts, but as a matter of law.

Could you support an appointee who was not pro-life? No. That would be like voting for somebody who supported the Dred Scott decision, and I couldn't do that.

What sets you apart from Bill Schuette in the life issues? Leadership. I've spoken at prolife rallies, at candlelight vigils. I aggressively worked on the Republican Party Platform in 1984 to make sure it had the strongest prolife language it's ever had, language which, by the way, was carried over in 1988. I've been to high schools and colleges to talk about this subject. I'm willing to be an advocate to change hearts and minds, not just a vote.

Are you pro-abortion, pro-choice or prolife? Bill Schuette's prolife...and is a firm believer that the thrust of public policy should be to prohibit abortion and encourage adoption.

What sets you apart from Clark Durant in the life issues? Bill Schuette has worked in Congress, has been in some very tough situations in Congress where he has voted 100% of the time with prolife activists....
