"Unplanned" Movie Opens in 5th Place Despite R Rating and Media Blackout, Expands to more Theaters

espite a media blackout, a 'R' rating designed to discourage viewers and little coverage outside conservative media circles, the new movie "Unplanned" opened in 5th place this past weekend and it will expand to even more theaters next weekend.

The film doubled its projection for expected box office earnings – bringing in \$6.1 million in its opening weekend despite a projection of \$2-3 million. That came despite the fact that Twitter has done its best to censor the movie's account, suspending it on Saturday and resetting it on Sunday. And major television networks, including Lifetime, Hallmark Channel and HGTV all rejected commercials promoting the film, according to The Hollywood Reporter. Fox News reportedly was the only major network to agree to run the ads.

The film took in an estimated \$6,110,000 or a cumulative per-screen average of \$5,770 on only 1,059 locations across the country.

The average would have put the movie in third place, according to Box Office Mojo.

Due to the storage showing, Pure Flix, the film's distributor, told LifeNews yesterday it will add an additional 600 screens to those already showing the film. That makes it so 1,700 screens will show the "Unplanned" movie, which earned a rare A-plus rating from CinemaScore.

"We are thrilled, gratified and humbled. We are so pleased that the American people have responded with such an enormous outpouring of support at the box office," Pure Flix told LifeNews.

"We are very happy for the success of this film," said Pure Flix CEO Michael Scott. "We hope that those on both sides of the debate will see Unplanned and begin to have their own dialogue. This film can be that spark to bring more hearts and minds to understanding the value of life. To bring the story of Abby Johnson to audiences and have them show up in such large numbers shows how the topic of abortion is so important to our nation."

Partially financed by MyPillow executive Mike Lindell, the film is the true story of Abby Johnson, a former rising star in the Planned Parenthood corporation. As one of the youngest clinic directors in the nation, Johnson was involved in upwards of 22,000 abortions and counseled countless women on their reproductive choices. Her passion surrounding a woman's right to choose led her to become a spokesperson for Planned Parenthood, fighting to enact legislation for the cause she so deeply believed in,



until the day she saw an ultrasound guided abortion that changed everything.

The film made national news last year when its lead actress Ashley Bratcher revealed that it wasn't until she was on set and filming that she learned that when her mother was pregnant with her, she nearly aborted her. Controversy has subsequently dogged the film, first when it earned an R rating from the MPAA, then when several television and radio networks refused to air commercials for the film and most recently on Saturday when Twitter suspended the film's page only to reverse itself an hour later after fan outcry and media inquiries. Going into the weekend, trailer views for the film had reached 250K. By Saturday morning, after an evening of strong word-ofmouth, trailer views climbed to 1.7 million. The film has a 93% positive audience score on Rotten Tomatoes.

"I am blown away by the public response to UNPLANNED as well as the box office numbers," said Bratcher. "Not only is it beyond my wildest dreams, but it has surpassed the expectations of critics across the country. Despite biased critic reviews written more like op-eds, the audience has spoken. I just learned that UNPLANNED received a coveted A+ CinemaScore. While that is truly an honor, the most rewarding thing about this weekend's opening is the flood of messages I've received from people experiencing healing and a change of heart."

UNPLANNED was written and directed by Cary Solomon and Chuck Konzelman, the writers/co-producers of God's Not Dead and God's Not Dead 2, also distributed by Pure Flix Entertainment.

"We are thrilled, gratified and humbled," noted Solomon and Konzelman. "We are so pleased that the American people have responded with such an enormous outpouring of support at the box office. It humbles us, and we look forward to seeing what happens in the weeks ahead."

Commercials for UNPLANNED are running on Fox News, The Christian Broadcast Network and conservative talk radio shows, including Glenn Beck's, according to the report.

Catherine Glenn Foster, president of Americans United for Life, told LifeNews that she was not surprised to hear about the rejections. She pointed to shows that openly promote abortion on television and the internet. The new Hulu series "Shrill" drew outrage earlier this month when the main character bragged about feeling "really, really good" and "powerful" after having an abortion.

"The entertainment industry no longer hides the fact that it lacks basic moral decency," Foster said. "It's now overtly dedicated to indoctrinating its viewers with a pro-abortion agenda, hiding from them the pain and emotional toll involved with the destruction of human life."



Legislative Update President Trump Cuts Planned Parenthood Funding \$44 Million, Sends Funds to Pregnancy Centers

President Donald Trump's administration whittled down Planned Parenthood's taxpayer funding by about \$44 million a year on Friday through Title X grants.

Some of that grant money now will go to a life-affirming medical provider called the Obria Group instead, Townhall reports.

The grant announcement was released Friday on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) website. Among those no longer receiving grants are Planned Parenthood affiliates in five states: Hawaii, North Carolina, Ohio, Wisconsin, and Virginia, according to the abortion group's website.

As Politico reports:

... seven Planned Parenthood affiliates in eight states are still set to receive funding through 2022 beginning on Monday. Oregon and Washington states' health departments will also continue to serve as the sole grantees in those states. Those states and Planned Parenthood are suing to block the new anti-abortion rules due to take effect May 3, and threatening to withdraw unless federal courts step in.

Planned Parenthood's \$16 million-a-year allotment is a steep drop from the \$50 to 60 million the group had been receiving annually. The change amounts to about a \$44 million cut in taxpayer funding to Planned Parenthood annually.

Meanwhile, the pro-life Obria Group will receive \$1.7 million a year in Title X grants to provide comprehensive family planning services to low-income individuals in California. Its services include pregnancy testing and counseling, prenatal care, HIV/AIDS testing, ultrasounds, cancer testing, well-woman care, pap smears, STD testing and treatment, adoption referral and post-abortion support, according to Townhall.

"Many women want the opportunity to visit a professional, comprehensive health care facility– not an abortion clinic — for their health care needs; this grant will give them that choice," Kathleen Eaton Bravo, founder and CEO of the pro-life health care group, said in a statement.

The money will go to seven clinic partners in four counties in California, according to the report. Three of the affiliates do not provide contraception, and two others will provide contraception but not use the grant money for that service, the report states.


Obria runs 21 health clinics and 11 mobile clinics in five states, and does not perform or promote abortions.

"With this grant, the administration has opened up a new avenue of health care choices for low-income and underserved women and their families in California," Bravo said.



A Letter to my Aborted Siblings

egan and Matthew, My sweetest big brother and sister. Words cannot describe how much I love and miss you. I've thought of countless things we would have experienced if you were here. You've been watching me, you know what I've been through; I constantly imagine what my life would have been like if you had been there to hold my hand through it all.

People often judge me for missing you; they ask me how it's possible for me to miss people I've never even met. Truth be told, I don't know who I'm grieving, and I think that makes it even more painful.

I constantly imagine who you would have been, what your personalities would have been like. It hurts to think about the possibilities. It hurts to think about what I missed out on.

I'm so sorry for all the times you've had to watch me cry over you; I'm sorry if you've ever felt responsible for my tears—you're not. I cry because I wish you were here to dry them. I wish you had been here to dry the millions of tears I shed growing up.

I would give anything just to have you here for a moment. For a mere second, just to hold you in my arms and love you and hug you and know what it feels like to have a big brother and sister. And I don't care what that moment would consist of.

Megan – we could be sitting in my bed watching a movie or I could be barging into your room and yelling at you for taking my stuff without asking me.

Matthew — I wish I could experience you catching me off guard and throwing me into a pool or having an overprotective and intimidating brother who irritates every fiber of my being. I don't care what it is, I just want to know you for a second.

I pray for you all the time. I pray that God wouldn't let you see my tears, but instead cover it up with the happier moments I experience.

I used to bargain with God — "If you give me my brother and sister back, I'll never say another cuss word. I'll never sin. I'll never lie again. I'll do whatever it is you want me to do, please, just give me my brother and sister back." No words can emphasize how much I would give for a simple hug, a short moment. I've imagined those moments to try to fill the void of your presence, but nothing can.

I'm sorry for surviving the horrors of abortion, and I'm sorry that the both of you had to suffer through that. You didn't deserve a single second of what that machine did to you. Of what a so-called "choice" did to you.

I would take the pain away from you in a heartbeat, without a single doubt. I'm sorry that you were aborted and I wasn't.

Your lives are valuable beyond words; I do my best to tell your story so that you may live on through me, and to help other moms recognize the value of their own babies.

I'm sorry for the times when I've cried over you. I know you see it, and I know that you don't want me to cry over you. I'm sorry in advance, because I know it's going to happen again.

I pray for you all the time. I pray God would give you an extra hug or kiss on the cheek because I can't. On my difficult days, I ask God to block your view on me so that you won't see me struggling.

Everything I do is to praise Him and to honor your lives, I want nothing more than to follow His will and to make you proud of me. I hope you're proud of the work I do - I do it all for the both of you (and for the moms and babies, of course).

I pray that He would love you a little extra sometimes, because I can't. Living without you is so, indescribably painful. Sometimes I walk through the halls of my high school and think: "You would have gone here. You would have walked these halls."

Sometimes I need advice and have nobody to turn to; it is in those moments that I miss you the most. I miss what I could have known. I miss the possibility of your light shining on our family.

I really hope you're proud of me. I know I've made mistakes, but I fight every single day to make sure that no baby suffers what you both suffered. I try not to think about what you suffered. I fight to be their voice. I wish I could have been there and been your voice. I beat myself up for it every single day, for surviving when you didn't.

I think about whether or not you suffered; and if you did, how much you suffered. Your lives were sacrificed so I could find my life in the Lord and I could pursue this work. I feel so guilty all of the time. I question why you didn't survive and I feel so awful for surviving. I love you more than you know and I would do anything for you.

I'm sorry that nobody fought for you. I'm sorry that nobody thought you were important enough. You're more than important enough. I grieve you every single day; next to God, you're the most important aspect of my life. I remember the first time I got up on stage, ready to tell my story. You would've been in the back cheering me on, I know it. You would've done the same thing at my middle school graduation, ecstatic for me to finally leave the place that created me into someone who had suffered from depression. You would have made the depression less difficult; I would have had someone to trust and lean on. You would have told me what I could look forward to. In reality, in those moments, I felt like I had nothing to look forward to.

As I sit here and write this letter with tears streaming down my eyes, I wish I weren't doing this. I wish I had never shed those countless tears. There used to be moments where I had wished I were sacrificed on the altar of choice instead of the both of you. I could keep going on and on, but just know this: I love you more than words can describe, and I'll be united with you soon. Until then, I have to be here and try to save the babies that were just like you.

While I'm still here, I promise I'll try to cry a little less because you're not here now and smile a little more because God has a plan for me. I love you both so, so much. Rest peacefully and don't worry about me.

Your lives were sacrificed. You both are gone, but your memory lives on through me. Rest assured, I will never stop fighting to honor your precious lives. You both will have two seats saved at my wedding and graduation. I will one day place a tombstone with your names on it next to our grandfather's. I'll go back and visit it every single year on August 2nd, the day you were aborted. My kids will know who you are. So will theirs. A photo of your ultrasound will be hung up in my office and in my home, to act as a reminder of the love I have for you, and to allow that love to push me through life's obstacles.

Survivor's guilt. Depression. Anxiety. Bullying. Separation. Loss. In my short 15 years on earth, I've experienced all of these things and more. But because of the Holy Spirit and the both of you, I was able to turn that pain into beauty. I'm able to use your lives to save the lives of others.

I love you so, incredibly, indescribably much – I'll never be able to put it into words. I hope the tears I'm shedding as I write this letter give you some insight as to how much I love you, miss you, and just wish you were here. I think about you every single day, I don't even think there's an hour that goes by without me thinking about you.

I look forward to the day when I enter the gates of Heaven and, after meeting our Lord and basking in His Glory, seeing the both of you standing behind Him with open arms. I love you, I love you, I love you so so much. I'll never forget about you and I promise to never stop fighting.

going to build a model of comprehensive, holistic medical clinics so that a woman [facing an unplanned pregnancy] never has to darken the door of a Planned Parenthood again," Bravo told The Daily Signal in an interview Tuesday.

"We are her health care provider," she said. "It is a brand that has been desperately needed for 45 years, to unite the [pro-life] movement under this medical model."

Title X grants fund family planning services for low-income individuals. In February, the Trump administration finalized a new

rule that prohibits Title X recipients from providing or promoting abortions.

The new "Protect Life" rule prohibits Planned Parenthood and other abortion businesses from receiving any of those tax dollars unless they completely separate their abortion businesses from their taxpayer-funded services. That mean housing their family planning services in separate buildings with separate staff from their abortion businesses and a denial of funds if they fail to do so. Most Planned Parenthood entities are not expected to comply.

Several Planned Parenthood affiliates and pro-abortion politicians are challenging the rule in a series of lawsuits. Their success is uncertain. Similar Title X regulations were upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in 1991 in *Rust v. Sullivan*.

Planned Parenthood used to see about 1.5 million patients a year through Title X, but its services through the program, including cancer screenings, birth control, etc., have been dropping steadily for years, according to its own annual reports. Meanwhile, its abortion numbers have been growing – a clear indication of its true focus.

The Trump administration also cut \$100 million from Planned Parenthood's international arm in 2017.

A recent Marist poll found that, by a double-digit margin, a majority of all Americans oppose any taxpayer funding of abortion (54 percent to 39 percent).
