Protections for the Medically Vulnerable

NOTE: HALO (Healthcare Advocacy & Leadership Organization) seeks to provide answers to the many difficult questions that surround end of life decisions. What follows here is taken from their website, www.HALOVoice.org. They publish an easy to read and understand publication called *Making a Difference*. HALO MISSION STATEMENT (Adopted 9/5/2018):

The mission of the Healthcare Advocacy and Leadership Organization is to promote, protect, and advocate for the rights of the medically vulnerable through direct patient and family interactions; through community education and awareness programs; and through promotion and development of concrete "life-affirming healthcare"* alternatives for those facing the grave consequences of healthcare rationing and unethical practices, especially those at risk of euthanasia and assisted suicide.

**"Life-affirming healthcare" is defined as medical care in which the paramount principle is the sanctity of life, which means that the life and safety of each person come first and each person receives medical care across their lifespan based on their need for care and never with an intention to hasten death, regardless of their abilities or perceived "quality of life."*

Principles for Medical Decision-Making Respecting the Value and Dignity of Human Life

1. No matter what life-sustaining procedure/medical treatment is in question, when in doubt, **err on the side of life**. A medical intervention can be tried with the option of stopping it if it proves ineffective or excessively burdensome *for the patient*.
2. It is the physician's obligation to truthfully and fully, in layperson's terms, discuss with the patient/agent/family/guardian the benefits, risks, cost, etc. of available medical means that may improve the patient's condition/prolong life. The focus should be on what the person making medical decisions needs to know in order to give *truly informed consent*.
3. The patient/agent makes the decision whether or not a treatment is too burdensome. (Note: The patient's life must never be ended because it is considered a burden to the patient or others.) If a patient wishes to fight for every last moment of life, this is a legitimate interest to be respected.
4. It is impossible to make morally sound, sensible, informed health care decisions based on guesswork



about some future illness or injury and possible treatment options. Health care decisions must be based on *current* information.

5. Two extremes are to be avoided: ****Insistence on physiologically useless or excessively burdensome treatment even when a patient may legitimately wish to forgo it. **Withdrawal or withholding of treatment with the intention to hasten/cause death.**
6. The object and motive for administering **pain medication** must be to relieve pain. Death must not be sought or intended.
7. Nutrition and hydration, whether a person is fed with a spoon or through a tube, is basic care, not medical treatment. Insertion or surgical implantation of a feeding tube takes medical expertise, but it is an ordinary life-preserving procedure for a person who has a working digestive system but is unable to eat by mouth. ****Acceptable** - During the natural dying process, when a person's organs are shutting down so that the body is no longer able to assimilate food and water or when their administration causes serious complications, stopping tube-feeding or spoon-feeding is both medically and morally appropriate. In these circumstances, the cause of death is the person's disease or injury, not deliberate dehydration or starvation. ****Unacceptable** - When a person is not dying -or not dying quickly enough to suit someone - food and fluids are often withheld with the intent to cause death because the person is viewed as having an acceptably low quality of life and/or as imposing burdens on others. The direct cause of death is then dehydration and starvation.

The Life-Saving Hyde Amendment in the Balance

The Hyde Amendment is named after its proposer, Congressman Henry Hyde of Illinois. The Hyde Amendment was first passed in a bipartisan manner in 1976 and enforcement began in 1980 after the U.S. Supreme Court overruled lower court challenges. The amendment prohibits direct Federal taxpayer funding of abortion in the United States, in particular through Medicaid funds. Best estimates show the Hyde Amendment protects 60,000 preborn lives every single year and has saved over 2.4 million preborn children since its inception. Hyde has been approved in Congress every year since 1976 and the current President routinely voted in favor of the amendment as a Senator. However the current leadership in Congress have made it clear they would like this to end in 2021. More worrisome, they are not waiting to debate the Hyde Amendment on its merits, as a number of legislative efforts to circumvent it are underway right now.

The recently passed American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, the so-called Covid-19 relief bill, avoided the Hyde Amendment and included tens of millions of dollars in subsidies for abortion providers. The much bigger threat is the Equality Act (H.R. 5) which passed the House of Representatives and awaits Senate consideration. The act claims to outlaw discrimination based on sex, but its definition of sex includes, "Pregnancy, childbirth, or a related medical condition." Fed-

eral agencies and courts have long interpreted "pregnancy related medical conditions" to include abortion. This means denying funding for an abortion to a Medicaid recipient would qualify as illegal discrimination and render the Hyde Amendment a moot point. Frighteningly, the Act goes even further and requires any medical provider receiving Medicare or Medicaid funds, including Christian and Catholic hospitals, to perform abortions. It would also eliminate any conscience protections for medical personnel who refuse to personally participate in abortions. It also criminalizes institutional expression of the Christian view of marriage.

Membership Renewal Changes

Pro-Life Senator Introduces Bill Banning Abortions and Sterilizations Without Informed Consent

Republican Iowa Sen. Joni Ernst introduced a bill Thursday [February 25, 2021] that would criminalize any sterilization or abortion procedure performed without informed consent from the patient.

The Iowa Republican's legislation builds off a September 2020 whistleblower complaint that alleged mass hysterectomies were performed on immigrant women by Dr. Mahendra Amin without their consent while they were being held at Irwin County Detention Center in Georgia. Amin, a rural gynecologist, has denied any wrongdoing.

The Informed Consent Act would criminalize such behavior, Ernst told the Daily Caller News Foundation.

"Whether it is a hysterectomy or an abortion, a doctor — or any individual for that matter — must not be able to perform these procedures without the consent of the woman," Ernst said in a statement to the DCNF. "Under this bill, if they do so, they would be committing a crime. This is simple and straightforward and something everyone — pro-life or pro-choice — can get behind."

The legislation would criminalize any abortion or sterilization that took place without informed consent and impose penalties of a fine or up to ten years in prison for individuals who perform an abortion or sterilization without informed consent.

It would also establish a felony for failing to report knowledge of such a procedure taking place without informed consent, "capturing the individuals who are complicit in the procedure even if they did not take part in performing it," Ernst's office said of the proposal.

The Informed Consent Act would, however, provide an exception in the case of emergency, such as saving the life of the individual or preventing "substantial and irreversible impairment," according to Ernst's office.

Republican New Jersey Rep. Chris Smith, who sponsored the bill in the House of Representatives, said in a statement to the DCNF that it is "shocking" that current law fails to provide penalties for forced sterilizations or forced abortions.

"The Informed Consent Act would criminalize these offenses and establish the same federal penalties in place for assault resulting in serious bodily injury," Smith said. "We must ensure that those who are complicit in such horrific acts are held accountable and provide justice for victims of this unconscionable human rights abuse."
