Currently, 37 cities in the United States are Sanctuary Cities for the Unborn. The City Council in Hillsdale has an ordinance under consideration that would make it the first Sanctuary City for the Unborn in Michigan. True, it is only likely to pass an ordinance banning abortion in a city with a sizable pool of pro-life citizens, but any of our readers in Livingston County or other pro-life cities or townships should consider finding out more.
