CANDIDATE SURVEY

LIFESPAN sent the following ten-question survey to each candidate for Governor, U.S. House of Representatives, State Senate, Michigan House of Representatives, County Executives, County Commissioner and various other offices in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties. Statements provided by candidates are on file at LIFESPAN's Main Office. Please call for further information.

- 1. The 1973 U.S. Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision allows for abortion for any reason, even as a method of birth control, even in the late states of pregnancy. Do you SUPPORT the reversal of this decision?
- 2. Do you SUPPORT a law banning partial-birth abortions?
- 3. Some public funds are used for abortions or abortion referrals, such as funding for Planned Parenthood. Do you OPPOSE the use of public funds (i.e. Planned Parenthood) for abortion or abortion referrals?
- 4. Human embryonic stem cells and human fetal tissue (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) are used in some medical experimentation which has no beneficial effects for the fetus. Would you SUPPORT legislation that would prohibit the use of embryonic stem cells and fetal tissue research, especially when the killing of the preborn child is necessary for this type of experimentation?
- 5. Would you SUPPORT a law banning so-called "reproductive cloning" cloning meant to result in the birth of a baby?
- 6. Knowing that the removal of stem cells from human embryos (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) results in the death of those embryos, would you SUPPORT a law banning so-called "therapeutic cloning" (somatic cell nuclear transfer)?
- 7. Do you OPPOSE laws allowing assisted suicide (so called "aid in dying")?
- 8. Do you SUPPORT honoring the wishes of patients who want life-saving treatment (including food and water) regardless of their degree of disability, age and "quality of life"?
- 9. Do you SUPPORT legislation that would protect health care professionals from being forced to distribute medications or provide medical care that violates their moral or religious beliefs?
- 10. Do you OPPOSE any changes in the Michigan Constitution regarding abortion, which currently allows abortion only to save the life of the mother?

NOTE: LIFESPAN is not a political organization and <u>does not endorse</u> candidates for election. We have surveyed the candidates as a service to our members. The questionnaires are on file at LIFESPAN's Main Office for your perusal. If you need further verification on a candidate's stand on these or other issues, please contact the candidate directly.

Where the Michigan Governor Candidates STAND ON LIFE

PRIORITIES IN MICHIGAN

GRETCHEN WHITMER said abortion was "life-sustaining" during the pandemic. She has made her promise to "fight like hell" for abortion the centerpiece of her reelection campaign, saying she would protect the rights of "menstruating people."

TUDOR DIXON said, "In the coming days, weeks, and months we will hear politicians and pundits weaponize the topic of abortion to further divide us. But make no mistake, they care nothing about the women now or in the future facing the enormous life changes and challenges that motherhood brings."

PARENTAL RIGHTS

GRETCHEN WHITMER supports an amendment to the Michigan Constitution that would give children an unlimited right to pregnancy starting "at birth." The amendment would repeal Michigan's parental consent for abortion law and end parental rights on any issue related to pregnancy.

TUDOR DIXON said, "We really believe that parents are going to get involved in this election in a way they never have before, because not only do we have this attack on women, an attack on our young girls, but we've also had an attack on education from this governor."

LATE-TERM ABORTIONS

GRETCHEN WHITMER voted multiple times in the Michigan Legislature to keep partial-birth abortions legal: a procedure involving partially-birthing a baby and stabbing them in the head.

TUDOR DIXON believes late-term abortions should be banned.

HEALTHCARE

GRETCHEN WHITMER made it a crime to recieve medical care at outpatient facilities—except abortion facilities, which were allowed to remain open during the pandemic. Whitmer ordered sick COVID patients to be placed into nursing homes, exposing the highest risk patients to the virus.

TUDOR DIXON said, "We will never forget what Gretchen Whitmer did when she put COVID patients in nursing homes. She kept families from loved ones. I know. My family lived it. We will hold her accountable." Dixon opposes shutting down health care facilities while privleging abortion facilities.

ADOPTION AND PREGNANCY HELP

GRETCHEN WHITMER vetoed multiple attempts in the Michigan budget to use funds for promoting adoption, increasing pregnancy help, and providing housing for "menstruating people."

TUDOR DIXON said, "We should make it easier to have and raise a family by creating policies that afford parents quality time with their children and make it easier to adopt."

FAMILY LEAVE VS. PAID ABORTIONS

GRETCHEN WHITMER called on corporate leaders to make supporting abortion a high priorty at the Mackinac Policy Conference. Squeezed by economic troubles, corporations are cutting family leave policies in favor of paying for abortions.

TUDOR DIXON said, "Corporations should step up and support paid family leave. No, this doesn't have to be a mandate. Great companies are built on great people. People will be happier, healthier, and more productive if their home life is good—their family is a source of joy, not stress."

LIFESPAN Candidate Survey

Right to Life - LIFESPAN is a non-profit educational and legislative organization. The first informs and motivates people to do something. The second speaks to changing laws. LIFESPAN can take sides and urge passage of legislation which is called lobbying. LIFESPAN is not "political." LIFESPAN does not have a political action committee (PAC) to elect or to defeat candidates. However, we can publish candidate surveys. This has been clearly permitted on a number of occasions by the U.S. Supreme Court. We can also list office holders and tell you how they have voted on various issues. Such reporting, as we do it, is not "political." Because this comes under Freedom of the Press, such information can be passed out through churches, without jeopardizing their tax status (again by a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court). According to legal terminology, this corporation can engage in "issue advocacy." The responses to the survey questions are dependent on the honesty and integrity of the individual candidates. LIFESPAN is not responsible for any candidate's response that differ from his or her public stance of the issues. Any questions or discrepancies should be directed to the candidate. ❖

Register to Vote!

Never underestimate the power of the ballot.

One of the greatest strengths of America is that all citizens are provided a voice through the voting booth. And every vote does count! Many an election has been won by a handful of votes or even just one vote.

But before you can vote in an election, you must be registered. You can register to vote through Election Day. Some clerk's offices have opened satellite offices for voter registration. You must show proof of where you live. Documents must have your name and current address. You can show a digital copy of any document. Acceptable documents include:

- Michigan Driver's License or State ID Card
- Current Utility Bill
- Bank Statement
- · Paycheck or Government Check
- Other Government Document

After registering, you can vote an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office or you can vote at your polling place on Election Day.

Military and overseas civilian voters have additional options to register. For more information, visit this page: https://www.michigan.gov/sos/0,4670,7-127-1633_8716-511653--,00.html.

To be eligible to register to vote, you must be:

- A Michigan resident (at the time you register)
- A resident of your City/Township
- A United States Citizen
- At least 18 years of age (when you vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail/prison

Check to see if you are registered at: https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us. If you are already registered, your voting record has links to:

- Your Sample Ballot
- Your Polling Place address for voting
- Tracking the status of your absentee ballot
- How to contact your clerk

As you can see, there are several options for you to choose from when registering to vote. But no matter where or how your register, you will vote in your assigned precinct in your hometown.

Why did I want to go?

I wanted to go to the training to meet more pro-life people, get more involved in the pro-life movement, and learn more about how to re-

spond to pro-abortion arguments. I always knew why their arguments were wrong, but I didn't always have the most effective way of changing their minds.

What did I do while I was there?

Each day started off with speakers presenting to us and diving deeper into why we believe what we believe as prolife advocates and how to explain this to other people who may disagree with us.

We then applied these skills to the streets of downtown Grand Rapids and used our apologetic techniques to help pro-abortionists see our side and hopefully get them to agree.


Would you like to participate again, and would you invite others?

Absentee Voting

Il registered voters in Michigan have the right to vote by mail. It's a safe way to vote and protect your health, and the process is secure and accurate.

To vote by mail, fill out the simple application you received from the State, print and sign it, and then mail or email it to your local clerk at: https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/clerk. When filling out the application, if you check the box to be added to the permanent absent voters list, you'll get an application mailed to you before every election. But there is no commitment. Even if you apply to vote by mail, you can change your mind and vote in person.

All registered voters are eligible to vote by mail

Due to the passage of the statewide ballot propels 18-3, all eligible and registered voters in Michigan may now request an absent voter ballot without providing a reason.

Check your voter registration at the Michigan Voter Information Center at http://michigan.gov/vote.

Requesting an absent voter ballot

Your request for an absent voter ballot must be in writing and can be submitted to your city or township clerk. (For assistance in obtaining the address of your city or township clerk, see Michigan.gov/Vote) You must request an absent voter ballot by submitting the application, large print application, a letter, a postcard, or a pre-printed application form obtained from your local clerk's office. Requests may be returned by hand, via postal mail, fax, or email, as long as a signature is visible.

Requests to have an absent voter ballot mailed to you must be received by your clerk no later than 5 p.m. the Friday before the election. If you're already registered at your current address, you can request an absent voter ballot in person at your clerk's office anytime up to 4 p.m. on the day prior to the election. If you're registering to vote or updating your address by appearing at your clerk's office on Election Day, you can request an absent voter ballot at the same time you register. If you request your AV ballot the day before the election or on Election Day, you must vote the ballot in the clerk's office.

Once your request is received by the local clerk, your signature on the request will be checked against your voter registration record before a ballot is issued. You must be a **registered voter** to receive an absent voter ballot, but you can register and apply for an absent voter ballot at

the same time. Requests for absent voter ballots are processed immediately. Absent voter ballots may be issued to you at your home address or any address outside of your city or township of residence.

After receiving your absent voter ballot, you have until 8 p.m. on Election Day to complete the ballot and return it to the clerk's office. Your ballot will not be counted unless your signature is on the return envelope and matches your signature on file. If you received assistance voting the ballot, then the signature of the person who helped you must also be on the return envelope. Only you, a family member or person residing in your household, a mail carrier, or election official is authorized to deliver your signed absent voter ballot to your clerk's office.

If an emergency, such as a sudden illness or family death prevents you from reaching the polls on Election Day, you may request an emergency absent voter ballot. Requests for an emergency ballot must be submitted after the deadline for regular absent voter ballots has passed but before 4 p.m. on Election Day. The emergency must have occurred at a time which made it impossible for you to apply for a regular absent voter ballot. **Please contact your local clerk** for more information about emergency absent voter ballots.

Spoiling an absent voter ballot

If a voter has already voted absentee and wishes to change their vote (because the candidate has dropped out of the race, or for any other reason), a voter can spoil their ballot by submitting a written request to their city or township clerk. The voter must sign the request and state if they would like a new absentee ballot mailed to them or if they will vote at the polls. This request must be received by 2 p.m. the Saturday before the election if received by mail. An absentee ballot may be spoiled in person at the clerk's office until 4 p.m. the Monday prior to the election. The voter can obtain a new absentee ballot there or vote at the polls. There is no option on Election Day to spoil an absentee ballot that has been received by the clerk. •

Reproductive Freedom for All Michigan Ballot Text

- (1) Every individual has a fundamental right to reproductive freedom, which entails the right to make and effectuate decisions about all matters relating to pregnancy, including but not limited to prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion care, miscarriage management, and infertility care.
 - An individual's right to reproductive freedom shall not be denied, burdened, nor infringed upon unless justified by a compelling state interest achieved by the least restrictive means.
 - Notwithstanding the above, the state may regulate the provision of abortion care after fetal viability, provided that in no circumstance shall the state prohibit an abortion that, in the professional judgement of an attending health care professional, is medically indicated to protect the life or physical or mental health of the pregnant individual.
- (2) The state shall not discriminate in the protection or enforcement of this fundamental right.
- (3) The state shall not penalize, prosecute, or otherwise take adverse action against an individual based on their actual, potential, perceived, or alleged pregnancy outcomes, including but not limited to miscarriage, stillbirth, or abortion. Nor shall the state penalize, prosecute, or otherwise take adverse action against someone for aiding or assisting a pregnant individual in exercising their right to reproductive freedom with their voluntary consent.
- (4) For the purposes of this section:

A state interest is "compelling" only if it is for the limited purpose of protecting the health of an individual seeking care, consistent with accepted clinical standards of practice and evidence-based medicine, and does not infringe on that individual's autonomous decision-making.

"Fetal viability" means: the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgement of an attending health care professional and based on the particular facts of the case, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus's sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures.

(5) This section shall be self-executing. Any provision of this section held invalid shall be severable from the remaining portions of this section.

Summary approved by the Board of Canvassers

Constitutional Amendment to: establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make and carry out all decisions about pregnancy, such as prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion, miscarriage management, and infertility; allow state to prohibit abortion after fetal viability unless needed to protect a patient's life or physical or mental health; forbid state discrimination in enforcement of this right; prohibit prosecution of an individual, or a person helping a pregnant individual, for exercising rights established by this amendment; and invalidating all state laws that conflict with this amendment.



MESSAGING: VOTE NOT ON THE PRO-ABORTION BALLOT PROPOSAL

KEY POINTS BASED UPON RESEARCH TO SECURE A NO VOTE NOVEMBER 8, 2022

OVERALL MESSAGING

1. Unforeseen Consequences Due to Confusing Language

The hastily conceived ballot proposal is **confusing** and will lead to potentially devastating **unforeseen consequences**. This is dangerous since it is a constitutional amendment and cannot be changed by passing a simple law.

2. Unrestricted: The Measure Goes TOO Far

The amendment **goes too far** and would allow abortion until, during and beyond birth, opposed by more than 70% of Americans. Failing to strictly define "fetal viability" and "physical and mental health" would lead to completely unrestricted abortion, even infanticide, in Michigan.

3. Unregulated: Basic Health and Safety Regulations Would Be Stripped Away, Significantly Increasing Risks to Women

If passed, the amendment would **repeal ALL current health and safety regulations** that require medical facilities to be licensed, inspected and clean, while also allowing non-medical professionals, such as social workers, to perform abortions. This is reckless, significantly **increasing the risks to women.**

4. Unravels Parental Consent by eliminating parental involvement in sexual decision making by minors.

This amendment would allow your minor child to have an abortion or undergo sterilization without your knowledge. If passed the constitutional amendment would allow school personnel to assist students in obtaining an abortion without parents' knowledge.

ADDITIONAL POINT OF CONFUSION

The amendment purportedly supports women, but the word "woman" is conspicuously missing from the language. The ballot proposal instead refers to an "individual," adding to the confusion about who retains the given right – the man or woman. (The first sentence of the ballot text says, "every individual has a fundamental right to reproductive freedom, which entails the right to make and effectuate decisions about all matters relating to pregnancy" ...it doesn't even specify "that individual's pregnancy.") The language further on simply references a "pregnant individual."

Biden Promises to Legalize Abortions Up to Birth Nationwide if Democrats Keep Congress

oe Biden promised to force states to legalize abortions through all nine months of pregnancy again Friday if Democrats win two more seats in the U.S. Senate in November.

CNBC reports the Democrat president made the remark in a speech to the National Education Association, a teacher's union, in Washington, D.C.

"If you give me two more senators in the United States Senate, I promise you, I promise you, we're going to codify Roe and once again make Roe the law of the land," Biden said.

The president urged women especially to vote for proabortion Democrats in November, assuming falsely that most women support his extreme pro-abortion agenda.

"The power to get things done is in the hands of the American people, especially the women out there," Biden said. "I don't think the MAGA Republicans have a clue about the power of American women. Let me tell you something: They're about to find out."

Biden also promised that, if Republicans regain control of Congress in November, he will veto pro-life legislation that reaches his desk, including a 15-week abortion ban, according to the report.

Last week, Republicans introduced the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, sponsored by U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham, R-South Carolina, to protect unborn babies by banning abortions nation-wide after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Exceptions would be allowed in cases of rape, incest or risks to the mother's life.

Polls consistently show strong public support for such legislation, and most countries across the world ban abortions after 15 weeks. But Biden and Democrat leaders have been attacking it as extreme.

In contrast, the bill that Biden wants to pass to "codify Roe" actually is very extreme. Nicknamed the Abortion Without Limits Up to Birth Act, the legislation would go further than Roe by forcing states to legalize the killing of unborn babies in abortions for basically any reason through all nine months of pregnancy.

The bill, which Democrats named the Women's Health Protection Act, also would end bans on sex-selection abortions and taxpayer-funded abortions as well as laws that protect women and girls, including parental consent for minors and informed consent laws that ensure mothers receive facts about abortion risks and their unborn baby's development before going through with an abortion.

Earlier this year, the pro-abortion bill passed the U.S.



House with near-unanimous support from Democrats, but Republicans blocked it in the U.S. Senate.

"That same abortion bill — the one almost all Democrats are promising to make law in 2023 if they get the chance — would also gut conscience laws that protect health-care workers, strike down parental-consent abortion laws, and override some state laws banning partial-birth abortion," according to National Review.

Americans – including many Democrat voters – support legal protections for unborn babies. Polls show strong public opposition to taxpayer funding for abortions and late-term abortions, and support for laws that protect unborn babies from abortion after the first trimester or once their heart begins to beat. Americans overwhelmingly support parental consent for minors, too.

A 2022 Marist poll found that just 36 percent of Americans believe abortions should be legal without any restrictions. Additionally, 73 percent oppose using tax dollars to fund abortions.

Similarly, a 2021 Associated Press poll found that 65 percent believe second-trimester abortions should be illegal and 80 percent believe they should be illegal in the third trimester.

Biden has become the most pro-abortion president in U.S. history. Last year, his administration began allowing abortion drugs to be sold through the mail without a doctor's visit. Biden also wants to get rid of the Hyde Amendment and force taxpayers to pay for elective abortions, and force VA hospitals and emergency rooms to abort unborn *babies*.





Website Linked to Multiple Suicides

horrifying website that advises people about ways to kill themselves was investigated by the New York Times last year. Reporters identified 45 people – many of them minors – whose suicides definitely were linked to use of the website, and hundreds more suicides of visitors to the website are suspect. According to one source, "On it, not only do people talk about wanting to die, but they share, at great length, how they are going to do it." Attempts to take this deplorable website down, including pleas to Google to unlist it, have not been successful.

The investigation revealed this "how-to" commit suicide website had six million views monthly—quadruple the views gotten by the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline website (recently renamed the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline).

Other suicide-promoting websites point users to jurisdictions where euthanasia and physician-assisted suicide are legal and "suicide tourism" is permitted. Tragically, in February, two sisters from Arizona, Dr. Lila Ammouri and Susan Frazier, committed assisted suicide together at a clinic in Zurich, Switzerland after researching ways to commit suicide. Neither sister was terminally ill; they reportedly just wanted to die together.

Despite the help available, suicide is not always preventable, but it should never be encouraged.

What does Proposal 3 really say?

It is the way political ads are constructed but flat out lies are simply wrong. 
