### **CANDIDATE SURVEY**

LIFESPAN sent the following ten-question survey to each candidate for U.S. Senate, State Senate, Michigan House of Representatives, County Commissioner and various other offices in Wayne, Oakland & Macomb Counties. Statements provided by candidates are on file at LIFESPAN's Main Office. (A separate Judicial Candidate Survey was also emailed or mailed to candidates for Appeals, Circuit, District & Probate Courts. See pages 19-22.)

- 1. The 1973 U.S. Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision allows for abortion for any reason, even as a method of birth control, even in the late states of pregnancy. In 2022, *Roe* was overturned by the Supreme Court. Do you SUPPORT their decision?
- 2. Do you SUPPORT a law banning partial-birth abortions?
- 3. Some public funds are used for abortions or abortion referrals, such as funding for Planned Parenthood. Do you OPPOSE the use of public funds (i.e. Planned Parenthood) for abortion or abortion referrals?
- 4. Human embryonic stem cells and human fetal tissue (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) are used in some medical experimentation which has no beneficial effects for the fetus. Would you SUPPORT legislation that would prohibit the use of embryonic stem cells and fetal tissue research, especially when the killing of the preborn child is necessary for this type of experimentation?
- 5. Would you SUPPORT a law <u>banning</u> so-called "reproductive cloning" cloning meant to result in the birth of a baby?
- 6. Knowing that the removal of stem cells from <u>human embryos</u> (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) results in the death of those embryos, would you SUPPORT a law <u>banning</u> so-called "therapeutic cloning" (somatic cell nuclear transfer)?
- 7. Do you SUPPORT the Michigan statute that prohibits assisted suicide (so called "aid in dying")?
- 8. Do you SUPPORT honoring the wishes of patients who <u>want</u> life-saving treatment (including food and water) regardless of their degree of disability, age and "quality of life"?
- 9. Do you SUPPORT legislation that would protect health care professionals from being forced to distribute medications or provide medical care that violates their moral or religious beliefs?
- 10. Do you SUPPORT changes in the Michigan Constitution which will protect the preborn from being destroyed by abortion?

NOTE: LIFESPAN is not a political organization and <u>does not endorse</u> candidates for election. We have surveyed the candidates as a service to our members. The questionnaires are on file at LIFESPAN's Main Office for your perusal. If you need further verification on a candidate's stand on these or other issues, please contact the candidate directly.

### LIFESPAN Candidate Survey

Right to Life - LIFESPAN is a non-profit educational and legislative organization. The educational side informs and motivates people to do something. The legislative side speaks to changing laws. LIFESPAN can take sides and urge passage of legislation which is called lobbying. LIFESPAN is not "political." LIFESPAN does not have a political action committee (PAC) to elect or to defeat candidates. However, we can publish candidate surveys. This has been clearly permitted on a number of occasions by the U.S. Supreme Court. We can also list office holders and tell you how they have voted on various issues. Such reporting, as we do it, is not "political." Because this comes under Freedom of the Press, such information can be passed out through churches, without jeopardizing their tax status (again by a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court). According to legal terminology, this corporation can engage in "issue advocacy." The responses to the survey questions are dependent on the honesty and integrity of the individual candidates. LIFESPAN is not responsible for any candidate's response that differ from his or her public stance of the issues. Any questions or discrepancies should be directed to the candidate. \*

### Register to Vote!

Never underestimate the power of the ballot.

One of the greatest strengths of America is that all citizens are provided a voice through the voting booth. And every vote does count! Many an election has been won by a handful of votes or even just one vote.

But before you can vote in an election, you must be registered. You can register to vote through Election Day. Some clerk's offices have opened satellite offices for voter registration. You must show proof of where you live. Documents must have your name and current address. You can show a digital copy of any document. Acceptable documents include:

- Michigan Driver's License or State ID Card
- Current Utility Bill
- · Bank Statement
- Paycheck or Government Check
- Other Government Document

After registering, you can vote an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office or you can vote at your polling place on Election Day.

To be eligible to register to vote, you must be:

- A Michigan resident (at the time you register)
- A resident of your City/Township
- A United States Citizen
- At least 18 years of age (when you vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail/prison

Check to see if you are registered at: <a href="https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us">https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us</a>. If you are already registered, your voting record has links to:

- Your Sample Ballot
- Your Polling Place address for voting
- Tracking the status of your absentee ballot
- How to contact your clerk

As you can see, there are several options for you to choose from when registering to vote. But no matter where or how your register, you will vote in your assigned precinct in your hometown.



### **Absentee Voting**

All registered voters in Michigan have the right to vote by mail using an absentee ballot delivered to their home. Voters can also request an absentee ballot directly from their local clerk's office. Absentee ballots are available beginning 40 days prior to every election.

Michigan voters can now join the permanent absentee ballot list by checking a box on the application to automatically receive an absentee ballot for every election.

#### Requesting an absent voter ballot

Voters can submit a completed absentee ballot application to their local clerk online. Once the ballot application has been processed, the absentee ballot will be mailed to the voter beginning 40 days before the election.

**Requirements:** The following voter information is required to apply online: Full name, Michigan driver's license or ID number, Date of birth, Eye color, Last four digits of the voters Social Security number & Mailing address.

**Deadline:** Online applications may be submitted until 5 p.m. the Friday before Election Day. To ensure there is enough time to receive and return an absentee ballot, plan on submitting the absentee ballot application online at least 15 days before Election Day.

#### Completing and returning an absentee ballot

Absentee ballot envelopes will contain a ballot, a secrecy sleeve, and ballot marking instructions. Voters who make a mistake when filling out an absentee ballot must request a new ballot from their local clerk's office for the error to be corrected.

**Mistakes** may include: Signing in the wrong place, listing the incorrect date, signing with a different signature than what is on file with your local clerk., & accidentally marking a non-preferred vote on the ballot.

Filling out an absentee ballot: Voters should complete their absentee ballot by carefully following the written instructions included with the ballot. Instructions may differ based on the type of election. Voters may contact their local clerk with questions about how to complete an absentee ballot.





Restore our land, Lord. I pray all of these things in the mighty Name of Jesus Christ. AMEN<sup>1</sup>



### From the President's Desk



Dear Friends,

Did you ever think that sometimes the world is going mad? Everything is upside down, especially in our great country. Today, truth is being mocked and replaced with lies. The more the lie is spoken, the more it is accepted as truth. Today, if you are pro-life, you can be accused of several crimes just because you speak out for the

truth; human life begins at conception and ends with natural death. Laws are being enacted that will allow people, who have these beliefs, to be prosecuted. An example of this is the Conscience Bill to protect pro-life doctors and other health professionals on abortion was BLOCKED by the Democrats in the Senate this June. Also, in May of this year, Joan Andrews Bell was one of several pro-life advocates who were given 27 months in federal prison for using their constitutional right to protest at an abortion chamber. This should frighten us all!

LIFESPAN cannot endorse candidates. But what we can do is survey all the candidates and ask them their pro-life views. We then present their answers to you in our Newsletter. The Candidate Survey you are reading in this newsletter must be shared beyond our membership. I ask that you share this information with everyone within your circle of family and friends. Knowledge is power. If you believe in the sanctity of human life, and will only vote party affiliation, if that party does not have a pro-life candidate, it is better you abstain from voting in that particular office. It is a matter of LIFE and DEATH. There are too many people in Washington, who are promoting and pushing perverted ideas of human sexuality and one of the things they are pushing the most is abortion. Abortion will be a primary issue in this campaign. The question you must ask is: do I want someone in Washington representing me, involved in legislation that permits the killing children and old people just because they are unwanted?

It will be up to you to share the candidates' answers with your family and friends. They, too, must answer the question: what does it mean to vote for a person who sees the child in the womb, not as a commodity (which can, be destroyed, for any reason), but, as a person from conception to natural death? chemical abortions compared to surgical abortions." In fact, the FDA's own label warns that one in 25 women who take abortion drugs will end up in the emergency room.

Why then would a court so often accused of wanting to end all "abortion rights" dismiss this case in a unanimous decision? It's important to know that the decision was not based upon the merits of the FDA's actions or its claims about the safety of abortion drugs. The court did not legalize these drugs. Access to mifepristone and how it is used was not altered at all by this decision.

Rather, the case was dismissed based on a lack of standing. In other words, the plaintiffs did not demonstrate "how they would be injured by the government's alleged under-regulation of others."

Another way to say it is that, once again, the Supreme Court did not settle the issue of chemical abortion any more than it settled the issue of abortion in the *Roe* decision or the more recent *Dobbs* decision. That work is still in our hands.

It is now abundantly clear that chemical abortion is the future battleground in the defense for preborn lives, only much more privatized and more difficult to regulate. That's why we need additional judicial and legislative action aimed at the abortion pill, as well as existing pro-life legislation to be enacted and enforced at the state and local level, especially that which limits the widespread distribution and mail-order capacity of mifepristone.

Strategies need to be devised for both pro-life and proabortion states, including the protection of pregnancy resource centers from being targeted by progressive state officials. We need to advance abortion pill reversal, which has shown remarkable outcomes in saving children of moms who have changed their minds after taking mifepristone.

Even more, the Church needs to make the case for the dignity of all life, making the path of forgiveness known and offering hope and healing in Christ. And we need courageous lawmakers to take the next step in putting an end to abortion, both chemical and surgical. Lives depend on it.

**Inserting the ballot into the secrecy sleeve:** Completed ballots should be inserted into the secrecy sleeve as instructed.

**Signing an absentee ballot envelope:** Voters must sign and date the return envelope on the provided space. Voters should use their signature as shown on their driver's license, state ID, or voter registration application.

If a voter's signature does not fit in the provided space, a shorter signature that resembles the signature on record may be used. Voters may also sign a shortened version of their first name, for example, "Bill" for the name "William".

Returning the absentee ballot: Voters have several options to securely return their completed and signed absentee ballot envelope. Absentee ballots must be received by a voter's local clerk's office by 8 p.m. on Election Day to be counted, with the exception of military and overseas ballots which must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by their local clerk within 6 days after the election in order to be counted. ❖

### Supreme Court Dismisses Case that Would Have Limited Access to Chemical Abortion

ast Thursday, the Supreme Court unanimously dismissed a case filed against the Food and Drug Administration for wrongfully expanding access to mifepristone, the first of two drugs utilized for "medical" abortions. The lawsuit was brought by the Alliance Defending Freedom on behalf of a group of medical professionals known as the Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine.

When originally approved by the FDA in 2000, mifepristone could only be prescribed by a licensed physician after an in-person appointment and required an inperson follow-up to ensure that the abortion had been completed "safely." In 2016, the Obama administration expanded the list of who could prescribe the drug and eliminated the two-week follow-up requirement. During the pandemic in 2021, the Biden administration first temporarily lifted the "in-person" requirement and then later that year removed it entirely. This allowed doctors to prescribe the lethal drug via telehealth and patients to receive it via mail.

In 2023, after the *Dobbs* ruling reversed *Roe v. Wade*, the Biden administration removed even more restrictions on mifepristone, including allowing retail pharmacies to dispense it. Early in 2024, Walgreens and CVS, the two largest pharmacy chains in the United States, announced they would begin offering the abortion pill mifepristone at select stores.

In the words of Alliance Defending Freedom, the actions of the FDA have "endangered women and girls by abandoning safeguards for abortion drugs, including inperson visits with a doctor to check for ectopic pregnancies, severe bleeding, and life-threatening infections."

Activists and major media outlets immediately celebrated the decision, having long claimed that increased



and unaccountable access to chemical abortion drugs is a matter of women's "healthcare." In fact, chemical abortions have been made the new front of the abortion cause, mostly because of the financial upside.

After all, abortion providers have long been an industry and abortions a consumer product. As of 2023, chemical abortion made up 63% of all abortion, making it the most widely "accessed" form of abortion.

Every major news outlet and activist who celebrated the decision also repeated the claim that chemical abortions are safe, as if the claim is settled science. Of course, mifepristone is deadly for preborn babies and not safe for their mothers. The drug starves preborn children of the nutrients they need to grow by blocking the uterus from receiving progesterone.

For mothers, the drug can cause heavy bleeding, incomplete abortion, and infection, among other problems. According to one report, it "has been tied to 24 deaths and more than 4,000 adverse events" or complications. Still, other data has shown that "one in five women experienced an adverse event following a chemical abortion, and rates of complication were four times higher in
