Taxpayer Funding of Abortion

The U.S. Supreme Court

Donald Trump pledges to nominate qualified individuals to the Supreme Court who will interpret the U.S. Constitution as written and not legislate from the bench. He appointed Justices Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh, and Amy Coney Barrett.

Kamala Harris pledges to nominate only individuals who share her view that unlimited abortion should

CANDIDATE SURVEY

LIFESPAN sent the following ten-question survey to each candidate for U.S. Senate, State Senate, Michigan House of Representatives, County Commissioner and various other offices in Wayne, Oakland & Macomb Counties. Statements provided by candidates are on file at LIFESPAN's Main Office. (A separate Judicial Candidate Survey was also emailed or mailed to candidates for Appeals, Circuit, District & Probate Courts. See pages 19-22.)

- 1. The 1973 U.S. Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision allows for abortion for any reason, even as a method of birth control, even in the late states of pregnancy. In 2022, *Roe* was overturned by the Supreme Court. Do you SUPPORT their decision?
- 2. Do you SUPPORT a law banning partial-birth abortions?
- 3. Some public funds are used for abortions or abortion referrals, such as funding for Planned Parenthood. Do you OPPOSE the <u>use of public funds (i.e. Planned Parenthood) for abortion or abortion referrals?</u>
- 4. Human <u>embryonic</u> stem cells and human <u>fetal</u> tissue (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) are used in some medical experimentation which has no beneficial effects for the fetus. Would you SUPPORT legislation that would <u>prohibit</u> the use of embryonic stem cells and fetal tissue research, especially when the killing of the preborn child is necessary for this type of experimentation?
- 5. Would you SUPPORT a law <u>banning</u> so-called "reproductive cloning" cloning meant to result in the birth of a baby?
- 6. Knowing that the removal of stem cells from <u>human embryos</u> (obtained through non-therapeutic abortion) results in the death of those embryos, would you SUPPORT a law <u>banning</u> so-called "therapeutic cloning" (somatic cell nuclear transfer)?
- 7. Do you SUPPORT the Michigan statute that prohibits assisted suicide (so called "aid in dying")?
- 8. Do you SUPPORT honoring the wishes of patients who <u>want</u> life-saving treatment (including food and water) regardless of their degree of disability, age and "quality of life"?
- 9. Do you SUPPORT legislation that would protect health care professionals from being forced to distribute medications or provide medical care that violates their moral or religious beliefs?
- 10. Do you SUPPORT changes in the Michigan Constitution which will protect the preborn from being destroyed by abortion?

NOTE: LIFESPAN is not a political organization and <u>DOES NOT ENDORSE</u> candidates for election. We have surveyed the candidates as a service to our members. Register to Vote!

Never underestimate the power of the ballot.

One of the greatest strengths of America is that all citizens are provided a voice through the voting booth. And every vote does count! Many an election has been won by a handful of votes or even just one vote.

But before you can vote in an election, you must be registered. You can register to vote through Election Day. Some clerk's offices have opened satellite offices for voter registration. You must show proof of where you live. Documents must have your name and current address. You can show a digital copy of any document. Acceptable documents include:

- Michigan Driver's License or State ID Card
- Current Utility Bill
- Bank Statement
- Paycheck or Government Check
- Other Government Document

After registering, you can vote an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office or you can vote at your polling place on Election Day.

Military and overseas civilian voters have additional options to register. For more information, visit this page: https://www.michigan.gov/sos/0,4670,7-127-1633_8716-511653--,00.html.

To be eligible to register to vote, you must be:

- A Michigan resident (at the time you register)
- A resident of your City/Township
- A United States Citizen
- At least 18 years of age (when you vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail/prison

Check to see if you are registered at: https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us. If you are already registered, your voting record has links to:

- Your Sample Ballot
- Your Polling Place address for voting
- Tracking the status of your absentee ballot
- How to contact your clerk

As you can see, there are several options for you to choose from when registering to vote. But no matter where or how your register, you will vote in your assigned precinct in your hometown.

Right to Life - LIFESPAN is a non-profit educational and legislative organization. The educational side informs and motivates people to do something. The legislative side speaks to changing laws. LIFESPAN can take sides and urge passage of legislation which is called lobbying. LIFESPAN is not "political." LIFESPAN does not have a political action committee (PAC) to elect or to defeat candidates. However, we can publish candidate surveys. This has been clearly permitted on a number of occasions by the U.S. Supreme Court. We can also list office holders and tell you how they have voted on various issues. Such reporting, as we do it, is not "political." Because this comes under Freedom of the Press, such information can be passed out through churches, without jeopardizing their tax status (again by a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court). According to legal terminology, this corporation can engage in "issue advocacy." The responses to the survey questions are dependent on the honesty and integrity of the individual candidates. LIFESPAN is not responsible for any candidate's response that differ from his or her public stance of the issues. Any questions or discrepancies should be directed to the candidate. *

Three Bills in Congress - Deceptive

Dear Concerned Citizen,

Congress is back in session, and we have our running – or marching – shoes on! As your U.S. Senators and Representatives fly into D.C. after the August recess, we expect pro-abortion members of Congress to continue to push their anti-life agenda.

This Summer, sadly, radical pro-abortion Senators attempted to hastily pass extreme anti-life legislation around the Dobbs anniversary.

The three bills listed below are deceptively named, claiming to restore freedom and provide quality health care. This legislation, however, would do the opposite and negatively impact mothers and their babies.

Freedom to Travel for Health Care Act of 2023

(Senator Catherine Cortez Masto (D-NV)) would block states' ability to enforce their pro-life laws on out-of-state physicians who illegally perform abortions in their state. It would also shield abusers and human traffickers who take vulnerable women and girls across state lines for abortions from liability.

Let Doctors Provide Reproductive Health Care

Act (Senator Patty Murray (D-WA)) establishes grant programs totaling \$80,000,000 that would help pay for the cost of abortion providers' legal services and advice as well as pay for increased security at their facilities. Pregnancy resource centers (PRCs), who have faced increased violence and legal attacks since the overturning of *Roe*, would not be eligible for such grant funding.



Reproductive Health Care Training Act of 2023

(Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI)) seeks to rely on our education system as a way to advance and expand the abortion agenda by increasing abortion related training for healthcare workers.

Our taxpayer dollars should never be used to intentionally end unborn lives and harm women! Our elected officials should support life affirming programs that help support women and their babies to live a life of flourishing.



Reflections by Luis Mata-Aguilar, College Student



Euthanasia IS on the Ballot in 2024

Abortion is not on the ballot for Michigan statewide and local elections this November, but

legal Euthanasia absolutely is on the ballot! Michigan Senate Bill (SB) 681, which would legalize Euthanasia, remains alive in the 2023-24 session of the Michigan Legislature. It is extremely unlikely to be brought for vote in the State Senate, let alone the State House of Representatives, but that may change depending on the results of the election this November. All the sponsors of SB 681 are Democrats, although it is certainly possible that some Republicans would vote for it as well. The big picture is that Euthanasia is almost certain to be legalized in Michigan during the 2025-26 legislative session if a pro-euthanasia **majority is elected in November.** Before casting a ballot for State Senate, State House of Representatives, State Supreme Court, or any other statewide office, be sure to find out their position on legalizing Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide!

As for the Federal election, it is well documented that Harris-Walz is the most pro-abortion Presidential Ticket in American history. This is in their own words, for in-

From the President's Desk



Dear Friends,

Saturday, Sept 10th, found many of us standing, praying, and singing at the burial site of Anthony, John, Joseph, Grace, & Mary. These little ones died by the abortionist knife in 1980. LIFESPAN was able to procure their little decomposed bodies and gave them a proper burial. We heard about these babies in

the press, so our Board discussed the need to treat them with respect and a proper burial. I went to Oakland County and spoke with Brooks Paterson, Oakland County Executive, and he released their little bodies to us. Desmond Funeral Home donated their time to pick up their little bodies and place them in one small casket. White Chapel donated the land and marker which would be their final resting place.

National Day of Remembrance (always held on the 2nd Saturday of September) is the day set aside to nationally remember these little ones that never will be able to see the sunlight or look into their mothers' eyes and smile. We must also take time to pray for these mothers and all those involved in an abortion. Often, they are so stressed out that they seek advice from those agencies that make money on abortion. Too many of our institutions and organizations like Planned Parenthood steer emotionally unstable women toward "getting rid of the problem" by abortion. The mothers are then left to deal with the aftermath of their decision, alone.

As I was driving to this event there was an ad from a political candidate expressing another lie. To paraphrase: if we did not vote for her, the other candidate would take away their rights for medical reproductive care-abortion. As usual, it's all a lie!

I am, and I'm sure you are as well, sick of the neverending political ads portraying abortion as health care. The public hears from our media that any person who is against abortion is insensitive, radical, and guilty of hate speech. It is so puzzling how the pro-abortion crowd, who are truly insensitive and radical on abortion, have so many followers. But then, why not? There is little truth from the press, medicine, academia on the subject. No one cries out for, or seeks the truth, on the humanity of pre-born human life growing in the womb.
