

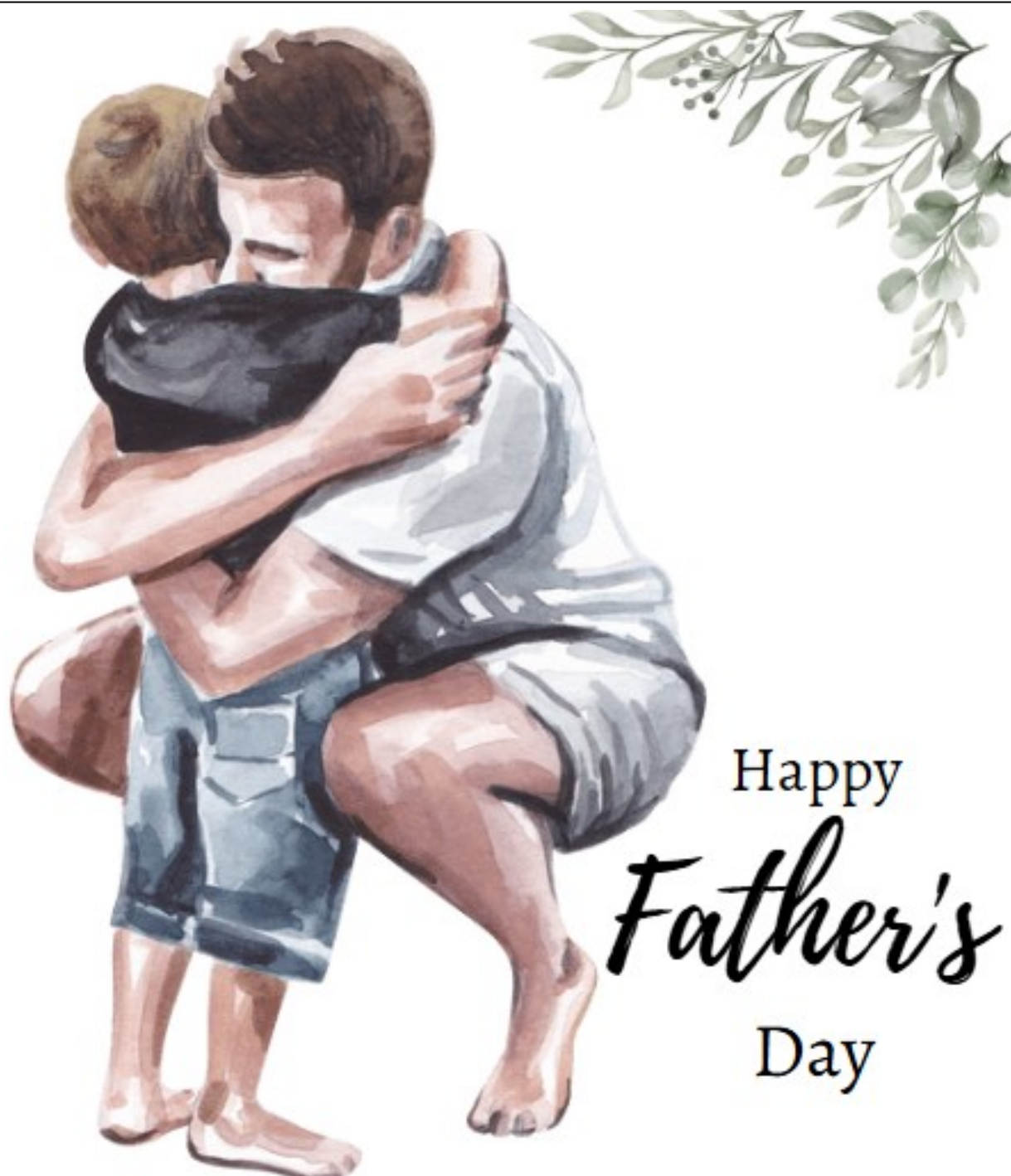

Reflections of a Pro-Life Foster/Adoptive Parent

I have had the honor of serving as a foster parent since January 2021. In that time I have supported five reunifications, adopted twice, seen one teen be adopted by someone else, and cared for a grand total of 22 children (including short-term respite). Our current household consists of me, my two forever sons, and twins (a boy and a girl) in foster care. All four kids are 15-year-old high school freshmen. One just got his learner's permit. My life is many things, but certainly not boring!

Unfortunately, the heated emotions surrounding the abortion debate often lead pro-choice advocates to drag foster children into the discussion. It's completely inappropriate. Children in foster care have lives worth living. I wish this went without saying. Are there struggles? Absolutely. No one comes into foster care without some amount of trauma; a child's removal from biological family is itself traumatic, in addition to whatever abuse or neglect may have led to the removal. But trauma does not negate a child's value. Nor does it negate a child's joy! Like anyone else, children and teens in foster care enjoy their hobbies, friendships, birthday parties, and connections with their family members (both biological and foster). They are not better off dead, so stop suggesting that. It's really gross.

Abortion is not the solution to the foster care crisis. There is a foster care crisis. Too many children are unable to live safely with their parents, child welfare departments are underfunded, there is constant turnover among social workers, and we desperately need more quality foster families. But unplanned pregnancies aren't the source of these problems. Not a single one of the children in my care entered the foster system as an infant! It is very common for problems to arise later in childhood: a parent dies, develops an addiction, or is incarcerated. These circumstances are not predictable before a baby is born. So unless your "solution" is to encourage abortion in every pregnancy, the argument makes no sense.

You could be a foster parent. Yes, you! You can be single and get licensed. You can work full-time and get licensed. I know because I did it. Granted, a single working mom won't be the ideal fit for every child. The placement staff take lots of factors into account. Some children need two foster parents, or a stay-at-home foster parent, or a foster parent with medical expertise. If that's you, so much the better. But plenty of children and teens just need the basics: a safe, stable, loving environment. Learn more about the process to become licensed.

Open Your Heart and Your Home



In Michigan, there are approximately 10,000 children in foster care and nearly 200 children who still need an adoptive family. We need your help to provide a safe, nurturing home for these children until they can be returned to their families. When children cannot be returned to their homes, foster parents are often asked to provide permanent homes.

What it Takes to be a Foster Parent

Foster children need caring individuals who can provide a safe and nurturing home. The primary goal during foster care is to reunite the child with his or her parents. This can take some time - we need caring adults who are willing to provide stability and safety for children in their care.

Foster parents should be committed individuals who are:

- Willing to work with the child's birth parents.
- Supportive of efforts to return the child home.
- Able to work with children who have emotional and behavioral needs.
- Able to encourage teens toward independent living.
- Willing to provide a permanent home if necessary.

Understanding the Foster Care Program

Foster Care identifies and places children in safe homes when they cannot remain with their families because of safety concerns. Foster families provide these children with the consistency and support they need to grow.

Our main goal is to return children back to their homes when it is safe. If a return home is not possible, adoptive families are needed.

Actor Kelsey Grammer reveals ‘lingering regret’ of abortion: ‘It eats at my soul’

In his recently-published memoir, “Karen: A Brother Remembers,” actor Kelsey Grammer revealed that two of his preborn children were aborted — experiences that appear to have greatly affected him. While society parrots the idea that abortion is solely a woman’s issue, Grammer’s story of abortion regret underscores the reality that men are also impacted by the killing of their preborn children. “The abortion of my son eats at my soul”

According to *People*, Grammer wrote that in 1974, a former girlfriend aborted their child. Though Grammer said he was “willing” to keep the baby, he “did not plead with her to save his life,” and instead “volunteered to have my son’s body vacuumed out of his mother’s.”

“I regret it. That’s all I meant to say,” he said, adding, “I know that many people do not have a problem with abortion, and though I have supported it in the past, the abortion of my son eats away at my soul.”

Grammer also railed against the abortionists responsible for killing preborn children, saying, “The doctor, or so-called doctors, who have executed generations of children in this manner — I have no idea how they call themselves doctors. Something about the ‘first, do no harm’ thing. But I offer no controversy.”

The topic also came up during a recent interview with *Parade* magazine, in which he spoke of his aborted son, saying, “It’s a lingering regret. Yeah, it lingers. I don’t know what else to say about it except I wonder what he might have done in life and how much potential existed.”

Years later, Grammer experienced abortion a second time when doctors convinced him and his wife Kayte that aborting their son was necessary so that the baby’s twin, Faith, might live. In explaining what happened, it’s clear that Grammer understands that abortion is the killing of a preborn child. “We killed our son so Faith might live. We wept as we watched his heart stop,” Grammer wrote. “It is the greatest pain I have ever known. Kayte’s scream was enough to make a man mourn a lifetime.” Faith is now 12 years old, and Grammer has seven born children in all.

Though these experiences appear to have had a profound impact on his life, his views about abortion seem unclear. “I supported the idea that a woman has the right to do what she wants with her own body. I still do,” he wrote. “But it’s hard for me. Still is.”

Grammer and his wife Kayte actually attended the March for Life in 2016, and the National Right to Life Convention the year prior. His wife Kayte posted to Instagram after the March, “There are better ways to avoid pregnancy than abortion. We advocate those. We can respect a woman’s right to choose and respect a child’s right to life at the same time. They do not need to stand in opposition. We need never kill another innocent life. Respect life.”

Grammer has even been criticized for proudly wearing a pro-life t-shirt - making it difficult to decipher his remarks (and hers).

Men regret abortion too.

Regardless of whether or not he supports abortion, it’s clear that Grammer — like countless other men — has experienced post-abortion grief and trauma. In sharing his story, he is helping other men impacted by abortion, affirming that they are not alone in the pain they feel.

A study from *Support After Abortion* found that “one in seven men may be coping from negative impacts from abortion.” The study report explains, “Men in the study reported depression, sadness, guilt, regret, anxiety, anger, thoughts of what could have been, emptiness, substance abuse, a sense of lost fatherhood, and other emotions.”

Live Action News has shared some of those men’s stories, I including in its **Can’t Stay Silent** campaign.

“I didn’t deal with any of the physical drama, yet it breaks my heart we took away a life; our own flesh and blood,” a man named Steven said. “I feel like this has become a permanent stain on our relationship and our lives.”

Spencer admitted, “I have lived with that regret for nearly 40 years. A day does not pass [that] I don’t think about my child! That one selfish act cost me more than I can fully express.”

David Bangs told *Live Action News*, “Being complicit in the abortion of my child was by far the worst decision I ever made. Abortion is a destroyer of relationships, of souls and of the most vulnerable.”

In 2019, the *BBC* published an article interviewing men whose children had died by abortion. “I didn’t know how I was going to survive,” explained one man. “I’ve thought about what happened every day for the last 32 years.”

Men’s voices matter.

Despite these emotions, men are continually told that they shouldn’t have a say in abortion, and they aren’t allowed to feel anything. Slogans like “no uterus, no opinion” and “my body my choice” work to exclude men from the abortion conversation altogether — unless, that is, they choose to agree with that perspective.

Grammer himself acknowledges that some of his grief comes from the fact that he did nothing to stop his ex-girlfriend from aborting their son. He, like so many others, had bought the lie that abortion is purely a women’s issue, but the reality is that every preborn child has a mother and a father.

When that child’s life ends, men may naturally experience significant grief, trauma, and regret.

Wayne Counties

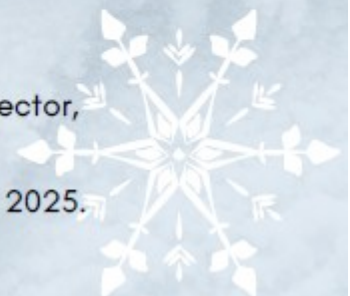

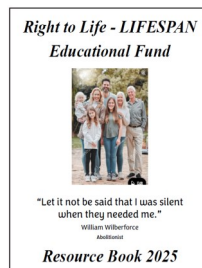

child abandonment especially for children with special needs was common in the pre-Christian pagan world. The early Christians perplexed the wider Roman society by rescuing infants exposed or abandoned by others because of belief that all people are born Imago Dei, in the image of God. As Western civilization enters a post-Christian phase it is not shocking that defenses of human dignity perplex people living in a state of neo-pagan atheism or practical atheism. While there are certainly differences, Rachel also identified the clear parallels between slavery and abortion, abolitionists and pro-lifers. The bodily autonomy of, "My Body, my Choice," is terribly similar to the sentiment that a slave is, "My Property." "I'm personally opposed to abortion but cannot force my views on others," coincides with the exact views of a plurality of Americans on slavery in the 19th Century. When the U.S. Constitution was written, many considered slavery an evil to tolerate for the time being, but by 1830 the positivist school of slavery began arguing that slavery was a beneficial social good. Sound familiar to a time when, "Safe, legal, and rare," has been replaced by, "Shout your abortion" and DIY chemical abortions? Abolitionists were considered out-of-touch radicals, mocked as moralistic simpletons, and targeted by the Federal Government under certain Administrations. Despite this, abolitionists operated an Underground Railroad which liberated thousands of human beings from bondage long before outlawing slavery outright.

Be not afraid pro-lifers! We stand proudly in the line of the early Christians and the Abolition Movement in defense of human life.

Our Five Unborn Children of God

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self-serve storage locker, were said to be 5 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

In both instances, those responsible stated that the bodies were mistakenly placed where they were found and that it was "error" or "accident" that caused them to be improperly disposed of.

Regardless of how the 5 preborn children met their deaths, it was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place for the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

Through the courtesy of A.J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."
